DESCRIPTION

The Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center Department Orthopaedic Surgery and Rehabilitation is seeking applicants for the position of Academic Adult Reconstructive Surgeon based at University Medical Center, our primary teaching hospital, and Texas Tech Physicians (TTP). With specialty clinics in multiple orthopaedic areas, our expert doctors at TTP utilize the latest treatment options to help effectively treat and manage all orthopaedic conditions and injuries.

- Texas license OR ability to apply for Texas license
- Ortho Surgery residency training and hip&knee fellowship
- The candidate should have exemplary clinical skills, a team spirit, collegiality and an interest in teaching and/or clinically based scholarly activity.

DUTIES

- Provide operative and non-operative care for patients with diseases and injuries of the hip & knee as well as other related traumatic injuries.
- Maintain schedule to include a minimum of 2 operative days and 2.5 clinic days per week.
- 3-4 days per month of general ortho call.
- Participate in resident education through clinical rotations, conferences, journal club and other teaching requirements for the Department's Residency Program.
- Conduct research activities individually or in collaboration with other faculty and/or residents
- Competitive salary along with generous state benefits package is available including PTO, medical, dental and disability insurance, as well as retirement. Professional liability insurance under TTUHSC umbrella plan; incentive augmentation bonus (quarterly, yearly, based on clinical performance/research/teaching/service). Additional benefits include professional development allowance for continuing education, memberships, licenses and other applicable expenses.

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Orthopaedic Surgery currently has 12 faculty physicians who are fellowship trained in children's orthopaedics, foot and ankle, hand and microvascular, joint reconstruction, musculoskeletal oncology, sports medicine and trauma. The Department proudly provides patient care and education in these diverse subspecialties for the populace of the South Plains region of West Texas, Eastern New Mexico and Western Oklahoma.

In addition to providing excellent patient care to our large community, each of the subspecialty trained orthopaedic surgeons within the Department have contributed to the publication of several important research articles in these multiple subspecialty areas.

The Department proudly supports an outstanding graduate medical education program with a commitment to produce excellent orthopaedic surgeons.

In July 2019 the department added a fourth resident per year, and in July 2020 there will be 18 total residents.

The Department provides patient care and education at three clinical locations – Orthopaedics at the Medical Pavilion, the Orthopaedic Hand Center in UMC's Medical Office Building II, and Covenant Children's Medical Office Building. 
