DESCRIPTION

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center is seeking an OB/GYN Specialist for a full-time faculty position at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor.

- BE/BC
- Texas license OR ability to apply for Texas license
- The candidate should have exemplary clinical skills, a team spirit, collegiality and an interest in teaching and/or clinically based scholarly activity.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Work full-time at Covenant Hospital, one of our teaching hospitals.
- Private practice in academic setting: Physician will see patients in the clinic, deliver and perform surgery on his or her own patients.
- Medical students are assigned to Covenant throughout the year and an upper level OB-GYN resident will rotate at Covenant on a monthly basis.
- Assigned call coverage with the Covenant Medical Group (average once a week or less), but this does not require that the physician be in the hospital. Covenant Hospital has a full time laborist (OB-GYN hospitalist) program that provides emergency coverage.

ABOUT OBGYN

We have a Medical Pavilion on our campus where our residents provide outpatient care to women of all ages under faculty supervision. At our Center for Perinatal Medicine we have a diagnostic center for ultrasounds, genetics and fetal testing services that serves a large portion of West Texas. In addition to the gynecology continuity of care clinic, we have a number of other subspecialty clinics including diabetes, high risk obstetrics, reproductive endocrinology & infertility, and colposcopy.

Our faculty and staff are focused on excellence in obstetrics and gynecology. Their enthusiasm and dedication to teaching, patient care and academics is our greatest asset.

The department also provides ample opportunities for research for students and residents. Each resident is assigned a research mentor in the first year and is expected to present a finished project in the third or fourth year at our annual resident research day.

The faculty is actively engaged in a variety of research endeavors across all areas of the specialty. Sam Prien, Ph.D. is the department's director of research. Dr. Prien's laboratory is located within the department and serves as a unique resource for both basic science and clinical research. Learn [more](#).

Our board-certified OB Hospitalists are in-house 24 hours a day, 365 days a year to care for obstetric patients. This ensures that patients without an identified OB, and patients whose private physician cannot immediately respond, are quickly seen by a board-certified obstetrician. Quality and safety are two of our primary goals, and our OB Hospitalists help us provide the best possible care for the women of our community.

Through our Obstetric Hospitalist Program, we operate a three-bay, obstetric-specific emergency department (OB-ED). A first of its kind for our region, and unlike many competitor facilities, this department ensures our maternal patients receive the highest level of care and that they are evaluated immediately by a board-certified obstetrician.

These are expert, dedicated, and specially trained nurses, whose priority is the safe and joyful arrival of each baby. Covenant's Women's Center's Labor and Delivery and Obstetric nurses are highly trained with many years of experience and are committed to providing compassionate care to reach optimum outcomes and ensure patient satisfaction. Over 40% of our nurses are specially trained with advanced certification in fetal monitoring and inpatient obstetric care. Our nurses and physicians work together to manage complex medical conditions that can arise in pregnant women.

All unit nurses are also required to complete and maintain advanced certifications under Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) and Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP).
